THE STORY OF KYLE ELLISON

The story of Kyle Ellison is one of a kind. Kyle was speaking at the Fourth Street church of Christ in Cullman, AL as I came by to visit Christians there and support the meeting. When I sat down in a pew, Jeffrey David, a Christian I'd met at a previous meeting a few months prior, told me that Kyle had formerly preached in the Baptist church. That caught my ear for it is rare to hear of a preacher being converted.

After services I spoke with Kyle and learned that for 9 years he indeed preached as a Baptist. He became a member of the Lord's church just two years ago. He is a younger talented speaker at 27 years of age. Today he is preaching at the Mt. Olive church of Christ near Birmingham.

I asked if I could interview him and he agreed and a fascinating story emerged. Kyle said that in his studies he saw the clarity of verses on baptism, saying, "It occurred to me that if I just read this without any coaching I'd likely just think baptism saves." He held several revivals a year among the Baptists but it got to a point where, with his conscience, he did not know what to tell people who came forward. He did not feel he could tell them to pray a sinner's prayer or to seek a sign at a mourner's bench. He knew Keith Stonehart, preacher at the Fultondale church of Christ, and expressed his doubts to him. Keith said, "I think you know what you need to do, the question is will you do it? Why would you walk away from here

knowing the truth and not be scripturally baptized?"

Kyle then went with Keith to the Fultondale church of Christ building and he was immersed in water for the remission of sins. It was Friday, July 22, 2016. When Kyle's parents learned what happened they were completely stunned. His mother contacted a close friend to the family, a Baptist minister, for she felt her son had been brainwashed. The preacher met with Kyle the next day, Saturday, but Kyle answered him patiently from Scripture. On Sunday Kyle contacted a local Baptist member to fill in for him, explaining that there were some personal matters he was working through. Then he called a meeting with the leadership.

The chairman asked why the meeting was called and Kyle explained he had been wrestling with a matter for some time and needed to get it off his chest. He confessed he did not believe that what they taught about salvation was correct and that the notion of viewing water baptism as a mere symbol and nothing more did not add up with what the Bible said. The men shook their heads in disbelief and sat in an awkward silence for a full minute. Finally the spokesman said, "Well, have you made up your mind?" Kyle said he

had. So he answered, "Well, we don't agree with you and can't support you. What do you think you need to do?" Kyle replied, "I believe I need to resign." Later that night Kyle made his announcement before the whole church about stepping down and explained why. In those three quick days, from Friday to Sunday, life radically changed, spiritually and with his work.

The next Sunday he attended at the Mt. Olive church of Christ. He knew he wanted to keep preaching but he was determined to preach only the truth now. The Christians there were impressed with his courage and even with his knowledge of the Bible from his own years of study. As they learned more about him and discussed matters they became convinced of his doctrinal soundness on the whole counsel of God. In time to come he was allowed to teach. And finally, as the church was in need of an evangelist, in January, 2017, he was asked if he would preach on a full time basis.

An incredible story about the power of God's word and a determination to follow where it leads, no matter the consequences. I am blessed to have met a man of great faith as Kyle Ellison.
